

STUDENT WELLBEING

At Carey Park Primary School, we have many supports in place to ensure your child has the best possible opportunity to grow as a healthy individual.

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST

Our School Psychologist provides a service to discuss, and problem solve social-emotional, learning or behaviour concerns. If you would like to access this service, please contact Mrs Kelly Dillon, Deputy Principal.

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER OFFICER (AIEO)

The role of the AIEO is to help promote inclusive practices within the school and build positive participation, communication and interactions between staff, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, their parents and families and the local Aboriginal community.

SCHOOL CHAPLAIN

Our School Chaplain is available to support students, parents, and staff. Providing support and advice on a range of personal and social-emotional concerns, appointments can be made by person through the front office, or by phoning the school office and making a time.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast Club runs each weekday and provides students with a range of healthy foods to start their day. Breakfast includes cereals, fresh and canned fruits, yoghurts, milk, warm baked beans, and spaghetti. Breakfast is generously donated by the Food Bank and is available for all students to ensure they have full stomachs and are ready to learn at school.

SCHOOL NURSE

The nurse visits the school to screen children for general health, hearing and eyesight. Parents will be advised of any outcomes from the screening that requires further action.

DENTAL THERAPY CENTRE

Once students are enrolled with the Dental Therapists, regular yearly checks will be given, and general work carried out. The Dental Centre is based in Adam Road Dental, contact number 9795 8904.

CHILD AND PARENT CENTRE- CAREY PARK

Child and Parent Centre - Carey Park is managed by Investing In Our Youth, in partnership with Carey Park Primary School.

Child and Parent Centre - Carey Park staff are here to support parents and carers in their role as first teachers. The early years of a child's life are incredibly important and have lifelong impact. For example, strong parent-child relationships in early childhood help develop a child's sense of belonging, self-esteem, and wellbeing.

Child and Parent Centre - Carey Park host a variety of on-site service providers including a Child Health Nurse, Speech Therapist, Financial Counsellor, Antenatal Group, and Immunisation Clinic. These services are available free of charge; however, bookings are essential.

SCHOOL UNIFORM AND SUN SMART POLICY

Our school uniform colours are bottle green & gold. A Uniform Shop is on the school site and is run by the P & C. Opening times are Wednesdays and Fridays, 8.15-8.45am in the room next to the Canteen.
